Maree Gleeson, Chair of the Doors to Mentors Action Group :				
Current stats: 38 active mentors; 15 registered mentees; 14 matches.				
 Program policies and procedures being reviewed regularly by the Action Group. 				
 Doors to Mentors <u>website</u> and <u>Facebook page</u> are being utilised to promote the program, 				
including showcasing of mentors via short video's				

- Sponsorship from Productivity Improvers has been utilised to put Mentor and Mentee through the Simulated Work Environment (SWE) https://fb.watch/4PshnLSPYj/
- Mentor Networking Event held.
- Additional schools engaged (outside of Ulverstone Secondary College) for mentee recruitment/referral.
- Collective ed. Central Coast and Ulverstone Secondary College are currently exploring a learning, careers and wellbeing hub for Ulverstone 'THE CENTRAL'
 Glen highlighted this as a great opportunity as a result of this way of working. UTAS have committed to having a regular presence here and we hope there will be a TasTAFE connection made. Council proposal going in at the end of this week, requesting use of Visitor Information Centre once this moves to the Hive

Jenelle Wells, Chair of the Chronic Health Action Group:

- Activity Plan developed including a risk management plan.
- Pathways being identified to reach target communities with people identified to join this Action Group.
- Significant responses to Our Healthcare Futures discussion paper (February) and the LegCo Inquiry into rural health services (March). These focussed on drawing attention to the importance of consulting directly with local rural and remote Tasmanian communities about health outcomes and access to community health and hospital services. We also included powerful stories from Central Coast residents to provide examples of barriers to access and availability and timeliness of health services
- Started identifying and reviewing Central Coast health data sources towards areas of focus for Central Connect's long term Community Wellbeing Plan and to provide a baseline for measures of success.

- Will be reviewing Connecting Care's community and chronic health literacy training package and following up with those trained prior to rolling out to front line workers and volunteers to train as community connectors.
- We propose offering trauma informed care workshops to interested Central Connect Action Group and Roundtable members. More info will come out about this soon.

Judi Walker, Chair of the Community Information & Resources Action Group:

- 2021 Activity Plan developed including a risk management plan.
- The main focus of action has been handover of the Connecting Care Portal and Local Resource Directory to Central Coast Council including development of a technical issues register and guidelines for verification of new listings and converting bulk listings to individual. The Portal combines Council's Community Directory with Connecting Care's Local Resource Directory. It can be accessed directly through the main page of Council's website by clicking the Community Directory tab on the right-hand side.
- Now the handover is well underway, Heidi Willard will relinquish her membership of the Action Group to Deb Lynch.
- The Community Directory will include a new category for Years 10 12 students to access local services and activities about their health and wellbeing.
- The Action Group is looking at ways to best showcase the Portal and Community Directory at the Central Connect launch as a strategy to promote communication of these to community.
- We're exploring ways to expand the scope and membership of the Action Group and providing advice to the Roundtable to inform the development of the long-term Community Wellbeing Plan.
- Tasmanian Community Fund grants are open. Will be looking at this for rolling out projects like Community Health Literacy training.
- As previously advised, we applied for funding to employ a Community Link Worker through the Healthy Tas Grants (result currently on hold until after the election). We need to keep this one on our radar as it brings together all of the pillars for Centra Connect (health, education, connection).

Feedback from the March Workshop

Maree and Judi provided an overview of the process undertaken to review and theme information collected during the March Workshop. This information will be used to develop the process for the Central Connect Community Wellbeing Plan 2022 – 2026.

Recommendations from Community Engagement Action Group for endorsement:

• World Wellbeing Week 2021: June 21 – June 30.

An official awareness week, this provides an opportunity for participants worldwide to promote an overall awareness for the wide-ranging aspects of wellbeing, including social, physical, emotional, financial, career, community and environmental wellbeing.

• Community Wellbeing Festival: June 21 – June 30.

Coordination of local events and activities that link to community wellbeing. This could include promotion of existing events and activities across the Central Coast and additional events and activities coordinated by CCLR members and partners. School based, community based and online events and activities to be included in the festival

Culminating Event: July 1.

Explore a culminating event that celebrates events and activities on offer throughout the Community Wellbeing Festival, recognising Central Connect's role in this and launch Central Connect.

Community Voice Collection

Recommendations from Community Engagement Action Group for endorsement:

- Commence community voice collection during the Community Wellbeing Festival
- Collect 1000 voices between June November 2021
- Plan for a range of collection methods paper-based surveys and iPad's at events, school surveys, interviews and online via social media platforms
- CCLR members/organisations involved to survey their contacts/clients
- Action Group to research and draft questions to be endorsed by CCLR

CCLR Members endorsed the Community Engagement Action Group and the above recommendations. Discussion points included:

- This Action Group may merge with the Community Resources and Information Action Group at some point.
- Kerrie pointed out that there is a Community Wellbeing Festival being held in Penguin during May.
- Glen suggested we look at holding another Youth Voice Workshop during this period via the Youth Leaders Council schools.
- Opportunity to connect with different groups and organisations to promote their activities.
- Damian highlighted that this is a challenging time for business and industry with end of financial year.
- Could be an opportunity for not for profits to spend left over funds before the end of the financial year.
- Glen outlined that USC had a wellbeing week last year that was very well received by staff and students.
 If we got in early enough, could try to align this for 2021 and hold as part of the Central Connect Community Wellbeing Festival.

Need to get promotion out ASAP to allow for this planning.
